Christ and The Christian

In the Holy Bible, God is seen as three persons in one: God the Father, God the Son - Jesus Christ, and God the Holy Spirit. Yesterday I drew a large Ichthys fish figure then drew another smaller fish figure in the center of the oval of the larger fish. It reminded me of the love of a parent wanting their child to obey them and to stay close by their side so they could take care of that child, and the trust and comfort the child felt as it stayed close to and admired and appreciated their parent.

It then also reminded me of Christ and the Christian. Christ is the larger fish who is always at the side of the Christian – the smaller fish. The word Christian means "someone who follows Christ" or "belonging to Christ". So, what better way to depict a Christian's life than to see them in a close personal relationship with Christ, trusting and obeying Him, and desiring to be like Christ and to be taken care of by Christ all of their life.

So, the next time you see this simple fish symbol of Jesus Christ, picture yourself as a smaller fish symbol, made in His image, who needs to stay close to Christ so you can develop a loving, trusting relationship with Him so God can take care of you throughout your life.
